The Jarrett Prairie Nature Preserve is the best known preserve in the Byron Forest Preserve District. These rolling hills of tallgrass prairie, oak savannas, and oak woodlands have been an Illinois Nature Preserve since 1992. In fact, the Byron Forest Preserve District was founded in 1980 to protect the rare prairie remnants that were discovered at this site in 1978. No dogs are allowed inside this nature preserve in order to protect rare grassland birds and other wildlife, but may remain on a leash along the Don Hamer Recreation Path. An adjacent 220 acres contain the PrairieView Golf Club.

- Bicycles are allowed on the recreation path only.
- Please remain on the mowed trails to reduce disturbance to wildlife.
