# Mission Statement

#### Preservation ~ Education ~ Recreation

The mission of the Byron Forest Preserve District is to provide for Preservation of Open Space/Natural Resources, provide Education concerning our Natural Environment/Heritage, provide Recreational opportunities and Enterprise Operations that are consistent with our Agency goals.

#### **Follow The Rules**

Recently, some Forest Preserve guests were not aware of the rules regarding horses, bikes, dogs, and motorized vehicle use on District property.

The following rules are in place at the Forest Preserve:

rseback Riding - No person shall bring into, unload, use, or ride any horse on District property except where allowed. At this time, there are no designated horseback riding areas.

- -Bikes No person shall ride a bicycle on any path, trail, roadway, or other area except where allowed. The only bike path at the Forest Preserve is the Don Hamer Recreation Path that leads from Sunshine Park in Byron into the Forest Preserve along the road to the Jarrett Prairie Center.
- -Dogs No person shall bring in, lead, or carry any dog that is unleashed or on a leash longer than ten feet onto District property except where allowed. Dogs are allowed are on the Don Hamer Recreation Path only. Dogs are not allowed to run at large (unleashed) on District property.
- -Motorized Vehicles No person shall operate any motorized vehicle, licensed or not licensed, anywhere on District property except on the roads, drives, and parking areas ided. Vehicles not so licensed include but are not limited to snowmobiles, go-carts, trail bikes, mini-bikes, and such other all terrain off-the-road vehicles.

### **Byron Recreation Path**

#### Provides Safe Routes for Children

The Byron Forest Preserve District has been a major participant and contributor with the Byron Recreation Path Citizens Committee over the past eight years. We have assisted with building the paths from the Byron Schools to north of town and from the Rock River Bridge to the Jarrett Prairie Center, PrairieView Golf Course, and Stone Quarry Recreation Park. Our Board of Commissioners over the years has felt an obligation to assist in providing a safe route (especially for children) in our district to our various recreation facilities that are located on the south side of the Rock River. We encourage all residents to use these paths to regularly visit our facilities.

- 1. Show respect to all participants and staff.
- 2. Refrain from using foul or obscene language.
- 3. Refrain from causing bodily harm to participants or staff.

# **State Recognized Recycling Station**

On October 20, 2003, Governor Rod Blagojevich named 22 Illinois companies and organizations winners of the Governor's Pollution Prevention Awards for significant achievements in helping the environment and economy

The 17th Annual Governor's Pollution Prevention Awards were presented in Springfield during a function hosted by the Waste Management and Research Center (WMRC), a division of the Illinois Department of Natural Resources.

The recipients reported pollution prevention projects with combined annual savings of \$13.4 million in material and disposal costs.

#### Service Organization Award

The Byron Forest Preserve District has a mission to provide for preservation of natural resources, to provide education about natural and cultural heritage, and provide recreation. The District developed a recycling station and is educating hundreds of students on recycling through the International Earthkeepers program Materials from the recycling station are collected and sorted twice per month, producing up to three tons of recyclable material like cardboard, glass, newspaper, plastic, and metals. The cost of hauling is covered through a cooperative agreement with the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department.

The station accepts glass, aluminum, plastic #1-5 & #7, tin, steel, mixed paper, cardboard, and newspaper. The bin is located in the maintenance parking lot at 7993 N. River Rd. in Byron. The station is open during daylight hours seven days per week. Please recycle responsibly by leaving the area cleaner than when you arrived.







# Improvements to Hole #11

As you may have noticed, we have made a few changes to hole #11 over the summer. The changes were made not only to improve the playability of the hole but also were made out of necessity.

First of all, three large trees on the left side of the fairway died. The dead trees needed to be removed, however, by removing them, it created more openings on that side of the fairway and green. After removing the three dead trees, we also cleaned out much of the undergrowth and scrub bush that guard the left side of the hole. The undergrowth and scrub bush was also removed from the area that leads up to the new 12th tee box currently being built.

The other changes to the hole include removing the out-of-bounds markers on the side of the hole, filling in and leveling out area at about the 150-yard marker, and removing the cart path that was only 10 feet from the front and left side of the green.

The changes now allow a player who wishes to try and reach the green in two shots a better chance to do so and also allows a player to find their ball and play it if it goes a little bit left instead of being out of bounds.

By taking the cart path out, now a player will not get penalized by hitting a good shot towards the green and having it bounce off the concrete which was positioned in front of and too close to the green.

The appearance of the hole is also more pleasing to a player's eye. Instead of scrub prush and a blocked view of both the 11th green and 12th tee, now a player will get a good view of the large trees that do guard the hole and lush grass that was planted in place of the scrub brush and cart path.

Overall, we are very pleased with the changes made to the hole. The hole was not nade easier or harder but simply made more playable to all levels of golfers. If you have not seen the changes, we encourage you to

As in 2003, the Gold Medal Classic will include a ladies division.


