# **Director's Message**

### From Executive Director Edward C. Clift...

Dear Citizens,

We experienced a very positive response to our first two issues of The Blaze and hope you will find many programs, facilities and special events for your entire family to enjoy in our Summer 2004 issue. We would like to thank Byron Bank for their generosity in sponsoring the Blaze publication.

We again want to publicly thank Stephen and Deirdre Nardi for their donation of almost one million dollars in land that enabled us to acquire a total of 492 acres for conservation and restoration of prairie for current and future generations. This project also qualified for the State of Illinois Open Land Trust Grant in the amount of \$892,500, with the Forest Preserve District contributing \$107,500 for this entire acquisition or \$218 per acre. We are ever so thankful to the Nardi's for their thoughtfulness and generosity to the Byron Community.

We will be opening the new Stone Quarry Recreation Park on Friday, May 21st with our first annual 8th grade graduation dance. Please look in the Stone Quarry section for all the summer activities planned for the entire family. If you have any questions or suggestions, please call Manager Jan Sealby at 234-8900. This park was built due to a public demonstration of a need and to specifically serve our teens and young families, along with other age groups in our community. I would like to address some of the questions we have been asked over the past few months concerning this project.

- 1. Why was Stone Quarry built? The Board of Commissioners was responding to the following local surveys, local focus groups, citizen requests and local census figures:
  - A. 2000 Census for the greater Byron area showed the following:
    - 33% of our population is age 19 and under
    - 48% of our population is age 20 54
  - B. Community Survey (mailed to 3,300 households) conducted in January of 2001, with a 22.5% return of surveys, listed some of the following:
    - •Services for youth in the community were found to be poor.
    - •Byron's weaknesses were found to be the lack of youth activities.
    - •Byron's needs were found to be additional recreational opportunities.
  - C. Byron Comprehensive Plan identified the following:
    - •Explore open space and recreational opportunities along the Rock River.
    - •Identify potential sites for future parks.
    - •Work with the Forest Preserve to identify potential areas for new recreation and conservation efforts.
  - D. Teen Forum (all day) conducted February 25, 2001, had the following results:
    - •85 teens participated
    - •15 adults participated
    - •They further refined what was needed in a new community park and community center for teens and young families from the teen survey that had been conducted.
  - E. Teen Survey conducted in 2000 with 574 teens completing the survey that identified the following interests and needs for our community:

Live Entertainment Dance Club Arcade Games

Darts Movies Coffee House

Pool Table

Skate Park

The following question was asked:

If Byron had a place to hang out with things to do, would you go to such a place? 88.15% responded Yes

# **Director's Message**

- F. Byron Community Forum held on September 28, 1999:
  - •85 adults participated in this all day workshop to brainstorm about the future of Byron.
  - •The group established the following committees to work on various issues that they deemed important to the community:

2. Are we building up long term debt to build these facilities?

NO, we are paying for each one as we go and they will be completely paid for (no mortgage) at the time of their completion. We have accomplished this by using funds in our capital development budget, since we have finished most of the improvements at other district facilities and also have received over \$350,000 in State Grants for this project.

3. Are we building a swimming pool with diving boards?

NO, we are building a water spray play area. This area will have 11 units that spray, splash, and shoot water for children to run and play in during the summer with no retained water in a pool.

4. Are we building another golf course?

NO, when the land negotiations started on what is now Stone Quarry, the board felt that since it was adjacent to our current 650 acres, it would be a very beneficial purchase for the District to secure. It certainly could have been used for many purposes, unknown at the time, including any future golf needs. By the time the property was purchased a year later, the community had identified the idea of a Stone Quarry-type development and presented it to the Board of Commissioners for consideration. The Board committed about ten acres for this purpose out of the total 76 acres.

5. Are we building a theater/auditorium?

NO, we are building a large meeting room for all age groups to use for various events, but no theater.

6. Is the Forest Preserve building the new hotel?

NO, even though it is proposed to be located next to our property, this is a private venture by a local investor.

7. How are we going to deal with potentially lost taxes from Exelon Nuclear?

Last October, the Board reviewed a four-year plan of reductions in staff and expenses that will allow us to operate within any new tax rate structure. We will be gradually implementing this plan over four years. Phase One of the reductions were implemented in December 2003 for the 2004 budget year.

We hope this explains some of the activities of the Byron Forest Preserve District and answers some of the questions we have been asked lately about several of our facilities, properties, and programs. ### **Follow The Rules**

Recently, some Forest Preserve guests were not aware of the rules regarding lorses, bikes, dogs, and motorized vehicle use on District property.

The following rules are in place at the Forest Preserve:

- 1 **Jeback Riding** No person shall pring into, unload, use, or ride any horse on District property except where allowed. At this time, there are no designated norseback riding areas.
- Bikes No person shall ride a bicycle on any path, trail, roadway, or other area except where allowed. The only bike path at the Forest Preserve is the Don Hamer Recreation Path that leads from Sunshine Park in Byron into the Forest Preserve along the road to the Jarrett Prairie Center.

  Dogs No person shall bring in, lead, or carry any dog that is unleashed or on a leash longer than ten feet onto District property except where allowed. Dogs are allowed on the Don Hamer Recreation Path only. Dogs are not allowed to run at large (unleashed) on District property.
- -Motorized Vehicles No person shall operate any motorized vehicle, licensed or not licensed, anywhere on District property except on the roads, drives, and parking ar provided. Vehicles not so licensed include but are not limited to snowmobiles, go-carts, trail bikes, mini-bikes, and such other all terrain off-the-road vehicles.

# **Byron Recreation Path**

### Provides Safe Routes for Children

The Byron Forest Preserve District has been a major participant and contributor with the Byron Recreation Path Citizens Committee over the past eight years. We have assisted with building the paths from the Byron Schools to north of town and from the Rock River Bridge to the Jarrett Prairie Center, PrairieView Golf Course, and Stone Quarry Recreation Park. Our Board of Commissioners over the years has felt an obligation to assist in providing a safe route (especially for children) in our district to our various recreation facilities that are located on the south side of the Rock River. We encourage all residents to use these paths to regularly visit our facilities.




# **New Arrival!**

The Byron Forest Preserve District recently obtained a T300 Bobcat, four attachments, and a trailer to be used for natural area restoration. The purchase was made possible by a 100% grant for \$63,000 from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources Conservation 2000 program. This program is state funded and provides money for non-profit groups to manage and acquire land, as well as to perform surveys and provide education.

The tracked machine is designed to operate with low ground pressure and create minimal disturbance of the soil on our sensitive natural areas. The attachments include a front rotary brush mower, stump grinder, tree shear with grapple, and an industrial fork grapple. These implements are designed to make natural areas restoration a more efficient and cost effective process. A single operator can now complete tasks in the fraction of the time it would take an entire crew.

The machinery is available for use on natural areas in Ogle and Lee counties. Contact Todd Tucker or Caleb Hardy at 234-8535 for more details. The Byron Forest Preserve would like to thank the Illinois Department of Natural Resources for the generous contribution.


Class size is limited to encourage a better student to teacher ratio. There are a variety of classes and lesson packages to choose from to fit the needs of all golfers.



# **Recycling Station**

The Byron Forest Preserve District has a mission to provide for preservation of natural resources, to provide education about natural and cultural heritage, and provide recreation. The District developed a recycling station and is educating hundreds of students on recycling through the International Earthkeepers program. Materials from the recycling station are collected and sorted twice per month, producing up to three tons of recyclable material like cardboard, glass, newspaper, plastic, and metals. The cost of hauling is covered through a cooperative agreement with the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department.

The station accepts glass, aluminum, plastic #1-5 & #7, tin, steel, mixed paper, cardboard, and newspaper. The bin is located in the maintenance parking lot at 7993 N. River Rd. in Byron. The station is open during daylight hours seven days per week. Please recycle responsibly by leaving the area cleaner than when you arrived.


Matt, the son of Holly and Phert, was an avid skateboarder and as interested in golf, until his life was cut tragically short at the age of 18 in a car accident in 1997.
