



Dear Citizens,

We have some exciting winter and spring activities for you and your family in this issue of The Blaze. We have some great programs at Stone Quarry Recreation Park for your elementary and middle school

age children such as Fantastic Fridays for grades K-2, Kids Night Out for grades 3-5, and Midnight Madness for grades 5-8. Check it all out and see what awaits you at the Forest Preserve.

The Matt Johnson Scholarship Fund had an outstanding mini-golf fundraiser this past June that benefits the Byron area youth; but, the need continues to increase. If you are interested in making a donation, please contact me directly.

New this year is our Membership Program. This program provides individuals and families the opportunity to be even more supportive of the Forest Preserve by becoming a member.

During the past several months of budget preparation for the 2007 year, it was decided to renovate the clubhouse at PrairieView Golf Club. We will also make some other changes that will improve the facility for our users.

The basement locker area will be reduced in size and the remainder of the area will become a large dining room seating approximately 40 people. This area will have two big screen televisions for our customers' enjoyment. On the first floor, we will move our bar operations from the concession line into the current dining room area seating approximately 32 people. There will be four large screen televisions in this area. A new patio seating approximately 32 people will be built on the south and west exterior walls of the clubhouse with an awning covering the entire patio.

The biggest change will be the new layout of the golf course itself. We will be going back to the golf course architect's original layout, which should be very exciting. Plan to come on out when we open and try out the new course and clubhouse!

# Matt Johnson Scholarship Fund

In 2003, the Byron Forest Preserve District announced the establishment of the Matt Johnson Funship Awards Program by Dr. Robert and Holly Johnson of Byron. The Scholarship Awards program is a fund of money that is available for the youth of the Byron community who are in need of financial assistance to participate in the activities of the Byron Forest Preserve District, such as skateboarding, golf, summer day camp, and any other scheduled programs.

Matt, the son of Holly and Robert, was an avid skateboarder and was interested in golf, until his life was cut tragically short at the age of 18 in a car accident in 1997.

The Byron Forest Preserve District Board of Commissioners and staff are grateful for the Johnsons' generosity in the creation of the Matt Johnson Funship Awards Program for the children of the Byron area.

Over the past three years, this fund has awarded over \$3,500 in scholarships to

the youth of our community. This program is available for all programs that are offered at the Byron Forest Preserve District.

To qualify for a Funship Award, the child must be eligible for the school lunch program and reside in the Byron Forest I serve District. # Wildlife & New Faces

# **Northern Harrier**

The Rock River Valley is home to several hawk species, from the common Red-Tailed to the Cooper's Hawk, known to prey on backyard bird feeders. One of our region's rare hawks is the Northern



Harrier, a hawk of open grasslands. The Norther Harrier, *Circus cyaneus*, can be found hovering over the Jarrett Prairie Preserve from early spring through the fall, occasionally staying through the winter but sometimes migrates south. The slim, long-tailed and long-winged Harrier is one of only a few raptors where the male and females look quite different. The male is white below with a mostly gray back and has black wingtips (see photo below). The larger female is brown on the back and striped brown and white on the chest (see photo above). Both sexes have a very noticeable white rump patch, making field identification pretty easy.

The Harrier hunts on the fly. A hiker will usually spot a Harrier as it slowly soars over the prairies on the hunt for small rodents, usually prairie voles. Unlike other hawks, the Harrier relies on its hearing as well as its vision to capture prey. The feathers of the face are stiff to help transmit sound. The Harrier's face is disk like, similar to that of an owl. Some refer to the Harrier as the Owl Hawk. The Harriers nest in the tall prairie grass and usually have 4-6 eggs. The females generally tend to the eggs and young while the males hunt.

This hawk has declined significantly over the last century. With the intensive loss of prairies and wetlands across the country, the Harriers have lost most of their hunting and nesting habitat. As a result, this species is very rare and endangered in several states, including Illinois. While I have not located any nests myself, at least one pair of Northern Harriers can usually be found in flight over the Jarrett Prairie Preserve. Prairie restorations around the state, like ours taking place on the recently acquired Nardi Hill Preserve, are important habitat creations for the Northern Harrier, as well as many other declining species of grassland



birds. The Northern Harrier is a showy bird species that illustrates the need to restore large prairies to protect not only hawks, but the entire community of prairie plant and animal species.

# **Thanks Joe!**

Joe Jonakin is a volunteer at the Byron Forest Preserve. Joe isn't a new face at the Forest Preserve, he has volunteered his time for many years. Currently, Joe works five days per week from sunrise until lunch time. He volunteers all year round, spring, summer, fall, and winter. The only things that keep Joe away from the Forest Preserve are rain and his caving trips out west. He is an avid outdoorsman and a licensed pilot.

Joe volunteers his time with the restoration department, working to help restore and manage the natural areas at the Byron Forest Preserve. Joe performs tasks such as picking native seed, removing invasive woody species from the prairie, clearing undesirable tree species from the woodlands, and pulling, spraying, and cutting invasive weed species such as garlic mustard and sweet clover.



Joe's hard work and dedication to the Byron Forest Preserve's restoration department really helps aid in the restoration and management of our natural areas. Thank you, Joe, you and your hard work are very much appreciated.

Above the Town is a contemporary bluegrass ensemble, blending a mixture of traditional bluegrass sounds with Celtic influences, jazz, and swing.


Above the Town provides a mix of the old with the new, performing music by the masters of bluegrass as well as original material.

# BCR reaches goals, seeks new ideas and projects through public forums

Byron Community Revitalization, Inc. is in a unique position—it has completed all of its goals and is now ready to create new ones. "We are proud to have accomplished so many projects," said BCR President Ed Clift. "We are optimistic we'll find new things the community of Byron wants." BCR's completed projects include the creation and installation of 18 new tourism and directional signs, installation of 5,000 new pavers in the downtown area, creation of Byron's Farmer's Market, creation of Stone Ouarry Recreational Park and completion of both a parking survey and a fast food survey..

"We're looking for new, fresh ideas from the public," said BCR Coordinator Rebecca Hines. "Even if your

idea seems out-of-reach, there may be some parts of your idea we can use that will benefit the entire community."

To gather input, BCR will be holding public forums on January 24 at 7 p.m. and January 27 at 2 p.m. Both forums will be held at the Jarrett Prairie Center. Two forums at different times are being held to give people more than one opportunity to share their thoughts, Hines said. Public input will be sought on new project ideas such as entry signs and a film festival. People should bring their original ideas as well, Hines added.

"We look forward to hearing what kinds of projects the community wants to see," she said. "If you've ever seen something in another community and wished
Byron had it, this is a great
time to let us know."
Other ideas that have been
brought up include a chili
cook-off, pie cook-off and
dog festival. A good way to
think about what Byron
needs, Hines said, is to think
about what you have seen in
other communities.
"If you've ever been travel-

ing and thought 'Byron needs this,' then that's an idea we'd like to hear," Hines said. "Even if we don't use that entire idea, there may be parts we can use or it may spark a new idea."



The Byron Forest Preserve District has a mission to provide for preservation of natural resources,



to provide education about natural and cultural heritage, and to provide recreation. The District developed a recycling station and is educating hundreds of students on recycling through the International Earthkeepers program. Materials from the recycling station are collected and sorted twice per month, producing up to three tons of recyclable material like cardboard, glass, newspaper, plastic, and metals. The cost of hauling is covered through a cooperative agreement with the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department.

The station accepts glass, aluminum, plastic #1-5 & #7, tin, steel, mixed paper, cardboard, and newspaper. The bin is located in the maintenance parking lot at 7993 N. River Rd. in Byron.
