

Director's Message



As time changes, moves, progresses, and revolves back again, so does the District and the technology that earmarks the decade into the chronology of a lifetime. The time of the "Green Age" has finally broken through—what does it mean? How will this change effect us? Is this change good?

All of these questions will be answered in time and will probably have a different answer and meaning for each one of us. The District is taking a leap forward along with other governmental agencies who are starting to build facilities utilizing fewer natural resources and that are more energy efficient over the lifespan of the building.

We are in the process of building a new LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certified Outdoor Education Center. The building will be located a few hundred feet south of the Jarrett Prairie Center, and will have

two large classrooms consisting of a total of 3,200 sq. ft. One of the rooms will be dedicated to our Earthkeepers program and bird watching; the other will be used for other programs such as scout badge workshops, educational camps, and will also be available for rental to the public along with the South Shelter. The rentable portion will have a sink, tables, and counter space for all types of uses for our patrons. The building will be unique in many ways, utilizing a geothermal heat/cooling system, wind turbine, pv solar panels, concrete and recycled glass countertops, reflective roof colors, energy efficient lights and many other green features. The building is scheduled to be complete near November 1st, and I hope that we will be able to educate the public and school children within our region about this new green technology. Come check out this new initiative!

Just a side note here...we've received many inquiries— The Nardi Hills Equine Prairie Preserve will also be opening up to the public this fall, so all you horseback riders check the newspaper in the coming weeks for the Grand Opening dates.



Fossil Trip to Mazonia-Braidwood Fish & Wildlife Area

We will travel to one of the state's most unique fossil collecting areas, an area paleontologists



consider one of the world's most important fossil deposits. The plants and animals found in the iron ore concretions lived about 300 millions years ago. We'll search for nodules that may contain fossils of ferns, insects, and maybe even a rare tully monster!

Team PrairieView finished 12th place with a score of 7 over par. A qualifying event was held at PrairieView to select the juniors to play in the event.



Great Memories at Soggy US Open

The day before I headed out to Bethpage to begin my duty as a volunteer with the grounds crew at the U.S. Open, I made a stop by Farmn-Fleet to find

a replacement for my worn out raingear. Little did I know at the time, but it turned out to be a pretty wise move. I had fully prepared myself for whatever was asked of me for the 8 days I spent on the course. Once the rain began to fall, I quickly realized there was no preparing for what was bout to come.

I arrived on Long Island early Sunday morning, a day before the practice rounds began. After a quick introduction to Bethpage Superintendent, Craig Currier, I was off to work in helping prep the Black Course for championship play. The practice round days went by fairly fast, a brief shower that Monday morning was just a teaser for what was about to come. The sun actually made an appearance on Tuesday and Wednesday, giving us volunteers a chance for a midday nap before



returning to the course in the afternoon to begin preparations for the next day. This is the point when everything started to blur together.

From a turf management standpoint, all the plans and schedules for how each day would play out went out the window fairly quickly on Thursday morning during the opening round. After finishing my first task of the day, mowing the tee boxes on holes 6, 10, 12, and 13, I was stationed with a squeegee by the green on #12. My sole responsibility was to keep the putting green surface playable as the morning's groups came through. Two other volunteers and I were able to keep ahead of Mother Nature's plans for a couple hours before the skies broke loose and halted play for the day. The rain stayed away Friday and most of Saturday. Shortly after the third round began Saturday evening, you guessed it, more rain moved in.

This time, I found myself standing watch over the #2 green. When the rain came this time, there was no chance to get ahead of it. The already-saturated ground could not absorb any more rain. It so happened that Phil Mickelson was in the group coming up the fairway when the rain came. The officials blew the horn suspending play for the night, but players had the option of finishing the hole they were on. Mickelson walked up to the green to survey the situation as we were attempting to squeegee it clear. It was a lost cause at that point, but Phil thanked us for the work we were doing and even engaged in some turf management small talk before deciding to mark his ball and come back on Sunday.

Sunday began early. By 3:45 am, every squeegee on Long Island was being put to use on the greens and fairways. The crew that I went out with that morning was about six strong and we were headed to clear the water off of #16 and #18 fairway. We didn't even get finished with #16 and the rain once again returned in full force. We actually headed back to the dorms where we were put up for the week (Farmingdale State University) for a couple hours of sleep before returning at 9 am to, hopefully, get round 3 in the books. Once they started play on Sunday,

we were all once again stationed near each green in anticipation of more rain. At that point, even the slightest bit of rain would have put an end to play for the day as there was no where for it to go.

The final round began late Sunday afternoon and after returning to my room somewhere after 10 pm, I was able to make some arrangements to stay an extra day to help out with the final round. Many of the volunteers were unable to stay past Sunday and had to return to their home course. Thankfully, with the support of everyone back home, I was able to stick around for the rest of the final round. After watching Tiger birdie #13 and #14 mid morning on Monday, most of the crew headed up to #18 to watch the end of the tournament. Shortly after Lucas Glover putted out to claim the championship, the grounds crew was called down to the green to have our picture taken with him and the trophy. It was sort of like we were claiming our piece of the prize. The celebration was short lived on my part. I took my time saying goodbyes to all the wonderful people I was fortunate enough to work beside for those eight days, gathered my gear, and the cab came to take me to the airport. I have always referred to this experience as a once in a lifetime opportunity, but that was before I spent most



of the week with a couple of guys from the crew at Pebble Beach. It just so happens that they are hosting a rather important tournament there next June...

The Byron Forest Preserve District has a mission to provide for preservation of natural resources, to provide education about natural and cultural heritage, and to provide recreation. The District developed a recycling station and is educating hundreds of students on recycling through the International Earthkeepers program. Materials from the recycling station are collected and sorted twice per month, producing up to three tons of recyclable material like cardboard, glass, newspaper, plastic, and metals. The cost of hauling is covered through a cooperative agreement with the Ogle County Solid Waste Management Department

The station accepts glass, aluminum, plastic #1-#5, & #7, tin, steel, mixed paper, cardboard, and newspaper. The bin is located in the maintenance parking lot at 7993 North River Road, Byron, Illinois. The station is open during daylight hours seven days per week. Please recycle responsibly by leaving the area cleaner than when you arrived. You no longer need to separate the items in each bin.


