I recently revisited Aldo Leopold's book "A Sand County Almanac" and came across an interesting section that puts a value on what the Byron Forest Preserve does when it purchases and protects the vital land in our region. It reads, "One basic weakness in a conservation system based wholly on economic motives is that most members of the land community have no economic value. Wildflowers and songbirds are examples. Of the 22,000 higher plants and animals native to Wisconsin, it is doubtful whether more than 5 percent can be sold, fed, eaten, or otherwise put to economic use. Yet these creatures are members of the biotic community, and if (as I believe) its stability depends on its integrity, they are entitled to continuance." The continuance of the plants and animals in our community are important for so many reasons and we need everyone's help to keep them protected. The Byron Forest Preserve District is committed to protect our sacred natural resources we all love and enjoy.





Prairie Life

Saving Our Sand Prairies

For an outdoor enthusiast, hiking through an Illinois sand prairie can make you feel like you are very far away from home. Vegetation in these unique areas grows sparsely atop the flats and ridges of pure sand, creating unusually large pockets of bare ground. Native plants have adapted different ways of coping with the dry conditions of these areas. Many plants in sand prairies have "hairs" on their stems and leaves, others have very thick leaves that store fluids, and many people are surprised to find out there is even a cactus native to Illinois. Some of the animal life is just as amazing, as these areas provide habitat to tortoises, burrowing mammals, many species of snakes, and a few types of lizards, including one lizard that is legless!

Unfortunately, as with many native Illinois ecosystems, sand prairies are extremely rare, with most not occurring in their original form. To bring back the beauty and diversity of these areas, brush removal is often necessary along with reintroducing the natural component of fire. Two acres of our main preserve located in the northwest corner was a degraded sand prairie up until last year. With the help of our lone restoration volunteer, the Forest Preserve was able to restore two acres of this unique and eyecatching habitat. Due to the ability of sand to preserve native seed in the soil, we already have many native wildflowers blooming there and encourage you to hike out and view the fruits of our labor!

Badgers are very secretive animals that are native to North America and to Illinois. They are the largest member of the weasel family. The badger's bodies are wide with a flat back and short stocky legs with long front claws. Adult badgers measure 25-35

inches with a short furry tail and can weigh up to 35 lbs as an adult. But don't mistake their size for how fast they can run, they can run between 10 and 15 mph. They range in color from grey to a yellowish brown with silver tints but all have the distinctive white stripes on the top of their heads. A male is a "boar", a female a "sow", and a young badger is a "cub". The badger lives in a burrow. The burrows are found in open places including prairies and badgers prefer sandy soils. They will live in open woodlands if the soil is right.

Badgers were once common in the northern three quarters of Illinois. But as Illinois was developed, the settlers cultivated the prairies and killed the badgers due to the burrows they would leave. The cattle and horses could step into the holes and injure themselves. Badgers were nearly wiped out by the late 1800's. But the population recovered by the 1950's and their range has even dipped down into southern Illinois. They have even been sighted at the Byron Forest Preserve.

The badger is a solitary animal except when mating and rearing young. It also has an excellent sense of hearing and smell. It will prey on mainly rodents, ground squirrels, wood chucks, moles, rabbits, ground nesting birds, and even a woodchuck. The badger will dig into the burrows of these animals and catch them underground.

Forest succession and encroachment into grasslands is reducing the habitat of the badger, an animal vital in controlling rodent populations. The badger is a nocturnal mammal but occasionally may be active during the day. They are not true hibernators but do spend a majority of their time sleeping during the winter. Practices that enhance or create prairie habitat are good for the badgers.



Making Our Beds

A decision was made in the spring of 2009 to begin rejuvenation on PrairieView Golf Club's landscape beds. The first step

was to bring back the original landscape designer, Cindy Storz, to consult in the refurbishment of the deteriorated beds. Step two was the hiring of a landscape intern studying at Kishwaukee College. Shannon Godbey, along with Cindy, began to attack the problems of the neglected beds. Much progress was made. (*Photo* #2)

In 2010, the board approved funds to move a step further. Money was approved for plant and structural materials and hiring of additional interns. In the spring of 2010, Allison Hentz and Robin Loval joined the team.


Annuals (*Photo #3*), perennial forbes and grasses (*Photo #4*), were planted or renovated in many of the landscape beds. New trees and shrubs were incorporated with boulders and limestone from our stone quarry. (*Photo #5 & #6*)

The woody area on 13 tee received attention by relocating plants from other shady areas. Jack in the Pulpit, Bloodroot and Ginger, along with a host of shade loving perennials have made this land-scape bed a cool retreat from the summer sun. (*Photo #7*)

The clubhouse landscape has received new plantings at the east entrance and planter boxes on the deck during phase one. Additional transplanting, planting and pruning of the north side beds will continue this fall in phase two. (*Photo #8*)

I would like to thank Todd Tucker, Executive Director and Steve Murray, Head of Golf Operations for their support. And thank you Board of Commissioners, especially Denny Cravatta, for catching the vision. Very special thanks to Cindy, Shannon, Allison, and Robin. Together we are executing the plan bringing the dream to pass.

The bin is located in the maintenance parking lot at 7993 North River Road, Byron, Illinois. The station is open during daylight hours seven days per week.
