

Mission: Preservation of Land


First and foremost, the Byron Forest Preserve District Board of Commissioners and staff members would like to extend our deepest, heartfelt condolences to the Clift family during this time. Our thoughts and prayers are with you.

The District staff is very proud of the purchase of the Tower/Colman farm located in the very northeast corner of Ogle County and Byron Township. The staff finalized the 280-acre purchase in December of 2010. The property has been named the Howard Colman Hall Creek Preserve after the local industrialist Howard Colman who was an inventor of machining equipment at his Rockford factory. Howard purchased the farm for the use of his family to enjoy the natural beauty and to ride horses. The property has many large open grown Oaks with a rolling topography and Hall Creek winding throughout the property.

The land is also a part of a much larger macro-site of a natural areas corridor, these other properties being Severson Dells Preserve in Winnebago County and Colman Dells Nature Preserve that is equally divided between the two counties and properties.

Much of the land is already of high quality. The District's restoration department will be restoring the remaining acreage that is in row crop back to prairie over the next 3 to 5 years which is in line with the District's mission. We will be establishing a small parking area on the Weldon Road side and restoring property boundaries and fences as soon as possible. It is our hopes to have the area accessible to the public by the summer of 2012. The District's Education Department is already developing programs to utilize the site for teaching our youth about stream ecology.







Man & Nature

In the beginning, our survival was based upon our understanding and coexistence with the natural world. As time ambles forward, our dependence on this force, and the organisms still bound to it, seems to grow progressively less important. Somehow though, even in the most modern of times, we are unable to break free from the frailest of threads which still connect us to nature. Had our own species never gained an understanding of nature, we would not be where we

are today, and hence what unites us lies within our soul. Thus, even today, the existence of both man and nature is dependent upon our interaction.

It's 6:27 am, and it is the middle of winter in Northern Illinois, I'm ready for work but the sun hasn't shown up yet. As I walk into the steward barn, I'm met with the familiar calm that comes with morning and go to greet the Forest Preserve's most important instrument in restoration. The instrument I'm referring to is the sole volunteer of the Restoration Department, named Joe Jonakin. He is as hard-working a person as anyone can find, with a gentle personality, and great passion for the outdoors. Joe is a graduate of Georgia Tech with

a degree in Aerospace Engineering, who is "semi-retired" from Hamilton-Sunstrand. He also has a great admiration for the Grand Canyon, and often travels there, volunteering in ecosystem recovery programs. Whenever Joe is at the Forest Preserve, ready to volunteer doing restoration work here, we feel very fortunate.

Joe has been volunteering at the Forest Preserve since 1992, when Mickey Bowman had him pulling horseweed on the Roundabout Trail. How we ever managed to get him to come back after that experience is anybody's guess, but we're glad he decided to stay. It was only shortly before his first experience volunteering that Joe had even learned to name a prairie plant, after Bob Severson pointed out side-oats gramma and little bluestem growing out of a bluff during a canoe trip on the Wisconsin River. From there, Joe's interest and knowledge of the original Illinois landscape only continued to grow. His unique understanding of what our restoration work entails at the Forest Preserve is a great asset for us, and we needn't discuss much before starting a day's work.

As with most winter days, today we are decked out in our PPE (personal protective equipment) a prepared chainsaw in hand, ready to return sunlight to the soil of a degraded woodland. We sweep the area, removing encroaching brush and trees not tolerant of the wildfires which once dictated their presence. Joe's help plays a vital role in simply helping us restore more than we could without

him. As Joe would say, "It takes boots on the ground to get anything done." We certainly cover more ground when Joe is here, and every acre we restore seems to set a new precedent. Last year, we feverishly worked completely restoring the canopy cover and brush encroachment of a miniscule 5 acres together, left wondering if we should have moved more rapidly in favor of partially restoring more. However, in the growing season, we found nesting red-headed woodpeckers, Baltimore orioles, badgers, and an explosion of native wildflowers, all of which weren't present beforehand. This type of response gave critical validation to our efforts, and we hope our work this winter will produce the same results in the spring.

We cut and stack all morning, and by 11 am it's time to get back to the shop for lunch. It's time for Joe to get home. Today, as with most, Joe and I glare into the un-restored, unhealthy acres of woodland at the preserve. Knowing there is still so much to do triggers a very humbling response, yet understanding that so few quality natural areas still exist keeps us driven. Spring Ephemerals

Most of us await the first signs of spring with eager anticipation. In February and March, I long for the woodland floors to burst into a colorful display of beautiful wildflowers. Spring Ephemerals are the plants that are responsible for this brilliant show of woodland flowers that emerge and carpet our deciduous forest floors each April and May.

The word Ephemeral literally means – transitory or quickly fading. So this definition adequately describes the life cycle of lese anxiously anticipated spring woodland flowers that surface at the end of winter and beginning of spring.

Spring ephemerals have a short life cycle period that usually only lasts 6-8 weeks. In that short amount of time, these plants must emerge, bloom, and reproduce. They must complete this cycle before the forest trees that tower above them fully leaf out which in turn shades these low growing woodland flowers from the sun. After they have completed their life cycle, most spring ephemerals fade back underground as quickly as they emerged leaving almost no trace that they were ever present. These plants may not be visible above ground – but underneath the forest floor, these spring beauties are still intact in their underground structure. These plant structures vary from root to rhizome (horizontal underground plant stem) to bulb. They may be out of sight and out of mind for the next 6-8 months but come the end of winter – I anxiously look out at the snow and long for the beauty of the vibrant woodland blooms known as spring ephemerals.

On the right from top to bottom are the most common of spring ephemerals found in our woods: Dutchman's Breeches, Spring Beauties, White Trillium, and Prairie Trillium.
