Stone Quarry Closing Labor Day 2012

WHY close it? The Park has been open for 10 years, attempting to operate and produce revenue. This did not happen. The District had to keep funding the loss to keep the facility open. The Board of Commissioners decided that since the Park has been losing thousands of dollars each year, they had to make the fiscally responsible decision to close the facility.

WHEN will it close? Labor Day 2012 will be the last open day at the Park.

WHAT about all of the amenities? The playground and the splashpad are very close to the end of their useful life without spending money on major repairs and/or replacement. The batting cages will be moved to the Byron School District/Byron Park District. Attempts are being made to relocate the skate ramps within the Byron community to be available free to the public. The basketball courts, volleyball court, and horseshoe pits may be relocated within the Forest Preserve. The staff is still exploring options regarding the mini-putt and the shelter. The red building and Quonset hut will be transformed into a maintenance facility.

WHAT about this new maintenance facility? The board and staff have been discussing this idea for a couple of years. The District needs an updated and more efficient maintenance facility for the Golf Course Maintenance Department and the Restoration/Maintenance Department. Several schemes of the location of the new facility were considered which included keeping both Maintenance Departments in the current location or moving one of the Departments to Stone Quarry Park to utilize the buildings.

WHY spend money on a new maintenance facility? With several land purchases and donations over the years, the District has grown considerably since many of the current maintenance buildings were built. Buildings have been added as funds allowed and these buildings will continue to be used. The older buildings are extremely dilapidated and need to be replaced.

WILL this project increase my taxes? NO, building a new maintenance facility will not increase taxes. A few years ago, President Obama established "Build America Bonds" for government agencies to stimulate the economy. The District has the funds in this bond to pay for the new maintenance facility.
