Byron Chamber of **Commerce hosts** Miracle on 2nd Street

Celebrate the holidays in Byron during the 5th annual Miracle on 2nd Street, Friday and Saturday, November 16 and 17. Miracle on 2nd Street has quickly become the local tradition that helps ignite the magical feeling of Christmas, and signals the start of the holiday shopping season. There is something for every member of the family to enjoy during this two-day event!

Luminaries will light the way to B.J. Way Park and the lighting of the Christmas tree at 6:00 PM Friday. While there, visitors are encouraged to view the BCR Tourism Committee's unique community holiday card display throughout the park. The cards will remain on display until January 1,2002.

The sights and sounds of the holiday season continue down 2nd Street from

6-9 PM on Friday, and from 10AM -3 PM on Saturday. Popular horse drawn carriage rides will be available, compliments of Stillman BancCorp. Outdoor live entertainment will be featured both Friday night and Saturday afternoon.

Byron Bank will sponsor limousine rides on Friday night only. The limo's will pick up riders outside of the Byron Bank, and drop them directly at Santa's door at 123 W. 2nd Street. Once inside, children can visit with Santa, while parents fill out a chance to win our beautifully decorated raffle tree. Visits with Santa will continue through Saturday as well.

In storefronts throughout downtown, visitors can view live mannequins (both Friday and Saturday) and listen to the sounds of the Prairie Youth Orchestra (Friday

night only).

Local Girl Scout Troops #486,581,53, 150, and #5 will be caroling at the Lucius Read House on Friday night, beginning at 6:45 PM. While at the Lucius Read House, be sure to stop and view the Festival of Trees sponsored by the Byron Museum District.

Several events are happening outside of downtown as well. Brand new to Miracle on 2nd Street this year is our holiday house walk. The walk will feature several homes in the Byron area, beautifully decorated for the holidays. Viewing these homes may inspire new decorating ideas for visitors to try in their own homes. Tickets will be available in advance at the Chamber of Commerce office and at various Byron locations. The homes will be open for viewing from 6-9 PM Friday night, and from 10 AM-3 PM on Saturday. Special drawings will be held at each of the Holiday House Walk locations.

The Byron Forest Preserve hosts the 10th annual Christmas Craft Show on Saturday, November 17 from 9 AM-4 PM, and on Sunday, November 18 from 1-4 PM.

On Saturday, Santa's "helpers" will be on hand to keep little ones busy while their parents shop at the craft fair. The childcare service is available for children 2 years old and up. A concession stand will be open throughout the day on both Saturday and Sunday. A free shuttle bus will run on Saturday between the Forest Preserve and Neighbor's Nursing Home, the Byron Municipal Building, and the Lucius Read House. 





Fall Junior Golf League Expands in 2001

PrairieView's popular Fall Junior Golf League realized a tremendous burst of growth this past season. Starting it's fifth season of play, the league nearly doubled in size - growing from eight teams to fourteen teams. League play concluded at PrairieView on Sunday, September 30 when 84 players on fourteen six-player teams completed their eighth and final nine hole head-to-head match.

The expanded league of 5th - 8th grade golfers kicked off play four weeks earlier on Wednesday, August 29 using a new two division format. Both the Hogan and Nelson Division teams played seven division matches and one interdivision match at six area courses. With PrairieView serving as the host course for nearly half the matches, the remainder of the league schedule was hosted by Emerald Hill (Sterling), Rochelle CC, Oregon CC, Silver Ridge GC, and Dixon CC. Each of these courses hosted at least one match and, like PrairieView, offered complimentary green fees to the league. Team sponsors provide funding for collared, logo golf shirts for their players.

In the end, the Bun Austin Chevrolet team from Sterling and Dixon CC team battled each other for the overall league championship. The Dixon's team depth of talent proved the slight difference as they edged out Bun Austin in an exceptionally close match. Other last day matches paired up Hogan and Nelson division teams finishing in equivalent places second through seventh within their division.

Immediately following last day play, 84 players plus 24 volunteer coaches, and over 100 parents gathered in PrairieView's Golf Pavilion banquet hall for the awards dinner. Trophies were awarded to the top six teams, as well as participation certificates and golf shop prizes for all who played.

Thanks to everyone who again helped make the league a continued success. Special thanks goes to Denny Dunham and PrairieView Assistant Golf Professional, Rob Hutzler, for their scoring help and to the Byron Forest Preserve for their continued enthusiastic support of the league and junior golf in general.

PrairieView Golf Course will be open for play in November/Early December, weather permitting. PrairieView Golf Course will remain open for golf on a day-to-day basis in November and possibly into December subject to weather conditions. Superintendent Steve Storz will close the course for the year once the greens and ground begin to freeze. Golfers playing on dormant, partially frozen putting surfaces greatly increase the likelihood of serious damage according to Mr. Storz.

Unfortunately, Prairie View golfers were unable to play into December as they had the previous two seasons. Let's hope mild November weather allows for at least extending the season a few more weeks and keeps our golf clubs in our trunks ready to go a few more rounds.
