NEW COURSE READY!!

The Byron Forest Preserve District in Byron, Illinois, is opening a new municipal par 72, 18-hole golf course on May 2, 1992. Bent grass is used on all fairways, tees, and greens. There are 5 different sets of tees on each hole giving the course a distance of 5,625 yards to 6990 yards. The course will be open 7 days a week providing for reserved tee times along with times for walk-ins. The PrairieView Golf Course, as it is named, contains a snack bar, pro shop, and driving range to accommodate the golfer. PrairieView will also schedule leagues and play days or outings for groups desiring these activities. For groups who wish to have a meal with their outings, food catering is available with prices ranging from \$6.50 to \$12.50 depending on the type of meal desired. Beer and wine are available for play days and outings. Should there be inclement weather, a large indoor multi-purpose room, with a capacity of 200, is reserved for each outing.

PrairieView is proud to announce that the district has purchased 60 brand new canopied golf carts along with 20 hand pull carts to serve the golfer. Sets of men's, ladies, and junior golf clubs are on hand for rental services. Ken Ledene, a P.G.A. professional is on staff to provide lessons and give advice on equipment needs and purchases. Re-gripping and other club repairs are other services provided.

The Byron Forest Preserve District has attempted to build a golf course and provide for all the needs of the golfer to the extent that he or she will have a very enjoyable experience at PrairieView. PRAIRIEVIEW GOLF COURSE INFORMATION

RESERVE TEE TIME: Reserve Tee Times are available seven (7) days a week by calling (815) 234-GOLF (4653).

Each reserve time will cost \$1 per foursome. Also available are seasonal reserve times on a first come, first serve basis, seven (7) days a week. Priority is given during certain periods to juniors, seniors, and ladies on weekdays. Play days will supersede reserve tee time (weekly and seasonal) with sufficient advance notification. It is our policy to leave every fourth tee open for walk-ins.

GOLFLESSONS: Private and group lessons will be available from Ken Ledene, Jr., our resident P.G.A. Professional, throughout the season.

The Byron Forest Preserve District welcomes business, social and service groups desiring a play day or golf league during the 1992 season.

PLAY DAYS: For the 1992 season, play days are welcome seven (7) days a week for either 9 or 18 hole groups from 20-200 golfers. Dates are available on a first come, first serve basis with requests to be made 45 days in advance of the event.

PrairieView offers 60 canopied carts

from our own fleet with the availability to supply additional extra carts as needed. We will be able to offer a number of menu selections for a group cookout following golf in addition to our regular concession items.

Complimentary services provided for play days may include the following:

- 1. Beverage cart and server for all alcoholic beverages.
- 2. One official's cart for play days over 20 players and two for groups over 100 at no charge.

The Byron Forest Preserve District will sponsor its inaugural 36-hole "Gold Medal Classic" tournament on Saturday and Sunday, September 19-20, 1992. The tournament will be open to the public with further information forthcoming.

CORPORATE PASS: PrairieView Golf Course offers to all businesses, a special 10-Play Corporate Pass for the 1992 golf season. The ten (10) individual passes may be used in any manner; for example, promotions, entertainment, bonuses, gifts, etc. on either weekdays or weekends. Also included are complimentary tee time reservation fees.

OUTINGS AND LEAGUE PROCEDURES

The Byron Forest Preserve District has established guidelines for groups who wish to have outings or leagues at the PrairieView Golf Course during the 1992 season.

Outings:

- 1. All outings are accepted on a first come, first-serve basis.
- Tee times are restricted to 6 AM -4 PM.
- 3. A deposit will be paid at the time the date is set.
- 4. All golf fees must be paid 10 days in advance including any reservation fee. The original deposit will count towards this reservation fee.
- 5. Play days must be requested 45 days in advance.
- 6. Outings can be 9 or 18 holes.
- 7. The golfers can be a minimum of 20 to a maximum of 200.
- Reservations made six months in advance require a \$25 deposit.
 Others require a \$50 deposit.
- Other requirements and informa tion will be given upon request.

Leagues:

- The district does not sponsor any league play. Leagues are to be run independently of the Byron Forest Preserve District.
- 2. Leagues will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- 3. Being in a league does not guarantee "tee" time, as all league golfers are to register in the same manner as any open recreational golfer. However, through proper cooperation of the league and course manager, play on the course can be efficiently planned.
- 4. All league secretaries are required to notify the manager as to location, time, day, and the number of golfers along with the starting date for the league. A contact name and number should also be included.





TURF NOTES...

It has been a busy summer for the maintenance crews at PrairieView. Though we have not yet achieved all of our objectives, much has been accomplished.

As a result of favorable weather conditions, turf establishment has been excellent. For numerous reasons, PrairieView looks much more like a golf course than it did opening day, May 1. At the time of this writing, the greens have completed a necessary growing phase and we are in the process of increasing their speed and trueness. You should begin to notice a dramatic improvement in their putting characteristics. Thanks to the Park Maintenance crew, only 11 uncompleted sand traps (out of 60) remain and six of those are cored and ready for sand. On Friday, July 24, 1992, Rockford Blacktop finished the coring and graveling of an additional two (2) miles of cart paths. This will greatly facilitate cart travel especially on the back 9 holes.

Thank you very much for your patience and support during this time of development. Soon, PrairieView will become a golf course we can all be proud of.


Tournament Was Successful!!

The first annual PrairieView Gold Medal Golf Tournament was successfully held on September 19-20, 1992, with 48 entries playing 36 holes of golf over the two days. Golf Course Superintendent Steve Storz and staff are to be commended for their efforts in getting the course ready for this first tournament ever at PrairieView.

The players were very positive in their comments about the bent grass fair-

ways, the speed and overall condition of the "double cut" greens, and the prospects for the future growth of this amateur event.

The event, open to both men and women, flighted players after 27 holes of competition. The overall champion was Bob McGavran of Rockford, posting a terrific score of 152 despite adverse conditions for the second round.

TURF NOTES...

During the past few weeks, golfers have experienced soil plugs and grass plant debris being strewn across the fairways at PrairieView Golf Course. This is the result of a maintenance procedure called "aeration". Simply stated, an aerator rapidly pushes into and pulls out of the ground a series of hollow, steel tines which remove cigar-sized plugs depositing them on the surface.

Aeration serves a threefold purpose. Turf, particularly bent grass, forms a dense network of stems, grass blades, roots, and mower clippings called "thatch" which tends to slow down the rapid penetration of water into the soil. It forms, in essence, a thatched roof over the ground. Disruption of the thatch layer by aerator is especially important on sloped areas where water tends to run off quickly and not soak in.

Plant roots, like human beings, require oxygen to break down carbohydrates, their energy source. Tiny spaces between soil particles frequently allow too little air to infiltrate into the soil structure. Resulting shallow, weak roots can't do an efficient job of absorbing water and dissolved minerals. This decreases the vigor of the whole grass plant. A cross section of an aerated soil profile will reveal a profusion of healthy, white roots in aerator holes.

Some stands of turf are too thin while others, like our bent grass fairways, have grown too thick and need thinning. The shattering and back dragging of plugs can help to improve both situations. In thin areas, the topdressing provides excellent conditions for germinating grass seed. This same topdressing contains microbes that assist in the decomposition of organic matter, accelerating the breakdown of the thatch layer.

Aeration is recommended for athletic fields and home lawns--any place where turf is grown. In most cases, this process will improve stands of turf grass.

Several lost items have been turned in and lay unclaimed this past season. If you wish to claim a lost item, please call or stop by the clubhouse before the closing date.

The Chicago District Golf Association indicates that the course will be re-measured and a course and slope rating established before closing day. Rating the course will allow PrairieView to offer a computer handicap service for next season.

PrairieView Clubhouse offers the opportunity for gift purchases including gift certificates for items such as golf lessons, motorized golf carts, and season passes. These gifts will still be available for purchase after the course closes on Sunday, November 1, 1992.
